




Mix n Mingles at Club Vista

Taranaki Network – Pink Challenge Ladies cooking



Sam, Terrwynn and Nicola have recently cooked Apple Crumble, Tacos, Enchiladas, Sausage & Vege casserole, and Sweet & Sour meatballs





The Pink Challenge Ladies' recipe for Apple Crumble

Apple Filling

- 6-8 Granny Smith Apples (green apples)
- 1 tbsp flour
- 1/2 cup white or brown sugar
- 2 tbsp lemon juice or water
- 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon

Topping

- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup (loosely packed) brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp cinnamon powder
- 125g / 1/2 cup butter, melted
- Pinch of salt

To Serve

Vanilla ice cream

Instructions

- 1. **Preheat** oven to 180°C.
- 2. **Apple -** Peel apples, then cut into 1.5cm cubes.
- 3. **Apple filling -** Place apples in a bowl. Sprinkle with flour, sugar and cinnamon, then pour over the lemon juice. Toss, then spread out evenly in a large baking dish.
- 4. **Crumble topping -** Place topping ingredients in a bowl. Mix until clumps form, like wet sand. Spread over the apples, crumbling with fingers if required to get that crumbly topping.
- 5. **Bake** for 30 to 40 minutes or until golden brown. Remove, cover loosely with foil to keep warm and let stand for 10 minutes before serving.
- 6. **Serve** warm with vanilla ice cream.





Meet the Candidates

The Everyday Networks groups in the Hutt showed their leadership by hosting and running a "Meet the Candidates" event.



This was the very first Meet the Candidates event in Hutt South during this election campaign, and for some of the candidates it was the first one they have ever been part of.

Members of the Fantails, the Dream Catchers, the Bumblebees, and the Tui Network groups all wrote questions and asked these to the candidates - great questions about inclusion, accessibility, and being a citizen.

We had candidates from 6 of the 7 parties that are running in Hutt South represented. We would like to thank them all for taking the time to meet us and answer our questions. We also would like to thank Erin from the Electoral Commission who came and talked to us about the voting process.

After the event, at least three people have enrolled to vote for the first time and also people have updated their enrolment details. Some people also mentioned that they had a better idea of who they would vote for and a couple of people had changed their minds on who they thought they would vote for.

Thank you to our panel of Network members who asked the questions, our time keeper (who kept everyone on track), Network members and whānau, members of the public, Community Connections staff and all the candidates (Neelu Jennings - Green

Party, Ginny Andersen - Labour, Ben Wylie-van Eerd - TOP, Lee Donoghue - NZ First, Max Rangitutua - Vision, and Emma Chatterton from Remutaka who came in place of Chris Bishop-National) for making this day a success.














Barbie movie fundraiser for the November Hui



? What is a Network group?

It is a group of people who choose to come together to help each other grow, and to both provide and receive peer support. A Network group usually consists of up to 9 members. These members live in the same city as each other. The group also chooses a facilitator – this is a staff person who can support the group if they need help and encourage the members to utilize their natural connections within their community.

? What is the focus of a Network group?

Members can help each other by sharing experiences and ideas, sharing their skills and abilities, offering advice, supporting each other's dreams and goals, looking out for each other, having fun and learning about their community together.

? How often do you meet?

Most groups meet weekly as a larger group but may split off into smaller groups for different activities or community involvement during the week.
